

Now, for those storms that decided to pay us a visit, let's share some insurance information. They have done some damage to some of our homes and to our fencing. The damage falls into different categories, owner responsibility and association responsibility. If the damaged item is owner responsibility, the owner will need to pay, do a claim on their HO6 policy, or get assistance from the government. There is help from the government using FEMA funding, the Small Business Association loans, and/or the State Funded Disaster Relief Program. Contact your roofer to get an inspection, a quote, and get it secured from further damage ASAP.

Some damaged items may qualify as the Association's responsibility and the claim with pictures and details of damage including the date it occurred, should be submitted ASAP on the Springwood website so the claim can be filed. However, if that damaged item, such as a roof leak, is deemed by the adjuster to have been caused by poor maintenance, or old age, that item will not qualify, and will be the unit owner's responsibility. Also remember, flood insurance is the unit owners' responsibility.

The association's deductible for a qualified repair/replacement cost, paid by the association's funds, is based on 5% of the value of that building per occurrence. So as an example, let's say the hurricane damaged a roof that qualifies to be covered by the association's insurance, and the home is valued at \$250,000, the deductible the association must pay for that qualifying claim would be up to \$12,500, the insurance will cover the amount over the \$12,500.

If you know the item was damaged prior to the storms, putting a claim on the associations policy will be a waste of time. The agent said the adjustor/inspector can tell by certain telltale signs, if the cause is prior to storm. .


Also, watch out for scammers. If you get any calls to do a repair, ask for their license number and their contact information, and then check them out before doing anything with them.


